2016 Year End Report

Let me start off by saying “Thank You” to the members of The Trenton Fire Department for your service to the citizens of Trenton. The work that each of you have done to keep our squad shifts covered and the professional treatment you provided to our citizens has been remarkable. Again this year we have had a primary squad respond 100% of the time to calls for EMS service. I am proud of each of you for your commitment to this department.

To all the city employee’s I want to say “Thank You”. In some way or another you all helped us get through last year. To the police officers who help us on many squad calls, your assistance was greatly appreciated. One thing I can say about all the employee’s is that we are all on the same team and following the same plan to make this city a better place.

In the year 2016 The Trenton Fire Department responded to a total of 1224 Fire and EMS runs. That is up 46 runs compared to 2015’s 1178 total calls.

I want to “Thank” Trenton City Council members and the city administrative staff for all the work that was done to allow us to purchase the old Bloomfield School property on N. Miami St. We are in desperate need of a new combined fire station to improve the living conditions for our part time crews, to have a more modern training area, adequate office area and that we can put all our equipment in one station. This will save time in responding to backup squad and fire calls.

EMS Division

The Trenton Fire Department Life Squad responded to a total of 1067 calls for service in 2016. This is an increase of 48 calls over 1019 calls in 2015. We transported a total 759 patients to area hospitals. We had 308 No Transport calls in 2016. We are getting more and more of no transports. A lot of the calls are family members who call about the patient thinking there is a medical problem. On arrival the patient refuse’s to be transported. We also get a lot of calls to evaluate a patient, after being involved in MVA, assaults, intoxicated or mental status. Most

of these patients do not require transports. We also had a total of 36 lift assist only. The large number of no transports effects the amount of revenue collected for EMS calls. Our Backup squad took 62 calls for service.

We provided a mutual aid squad to 5 different departments for a total of 54 calls. The departments were, St. Clair Twp. 27, Madison Twp. 15, Wayne Twp. 3, Seven Mile 2 and Middletown 7.

We received mutual squad's from 3 departments for a total of 41 calls. Those departments were St. Clair Twp. 15, Madison Twp. 21 and Monroe 5.

Heroin and prescription drug overdoses were a big part of 2016. We had 38 Heroin Overdoses with 3 deaths. Our members had 31 saves after administering Narcan to the patients. We had 11 Prescription Drug Overdoses with 2 deaths.

Our squad traveled 7,920 miles in transporting the 759 patients to hospitals. The level of care provided was, Advanced Life Support 2, 11 patients, Advanced Life Support, 491 patients and Basic Life Support, 257 patients.

We transported to Atrium Hosp. 417, Bethesda Butler Co. Hosp. 40, Children's Liberty Hosp. 38, Ft. Hamilton Hosp. 179, Mercy Fairfield Hosp. 29, U.C. West Chester Hosp. 54 and Careflight flew out 1 patient.

Fire Division

The Trenton Fire Department responded to 157 calls for service in 2016. That's a decrease of 2 calls from the year 2015. The fire department responded to a total of 11 structure fires, with 5 structure fires being mutual to other departments. We responded on a total of 4 vehicle fires.

Some of the other calls we responded to included:

We provided mutual aid to 3 Fire Departments on structure fires. Monroe 1, Madison Twp. 1 and Middletown 3

We received mutual on 1 structure fire from St. Clair Twp. and Madison Twp.

Fire Prevention

Fire Marshal Kevin Grathwohl completed a total of 160 Inspections, 134 were Business Fire Inspections, 4 were Business Fire Re-inspections, 10 Fire Business Fire Preplan Inspections and 12 State of Ohio home inspections.

During Fire Prevention Week, 450 students from Babeck Elementary School visited Fire Station 52 and viewed the ambulance and ladder truck. There were 4 Community Fire Prevention Programs, Barn n Bunk, Community Night Out, 200 year celebration and it was estimated that we saw about 500 children. Fire department attended 1 special needs child's birthday party with 11 children in attendance. There was 1 Elderly Safety Educational event with 75 elderly adults from Tamarind Square. We had 4 Fire Station Tours with 30 children and 10 adults.

Training

We conducted 52 Fire and EMS training sessions during the year. The average number of participants for each training session was 14 members.

We completed building the roof ventilation simulator, this simulator will allow us to practice cutting holes in the roof for ventilation. This is a hands on training of using chain saws, rescue saws and axe's.
